Out of the world

The sexually immoral people of this world

Not judge those outside.
Judge those inside.

- 1. For what have I to do with judging those also who are outside?
- 2. Do you not judge those who are inside?

Not even to eat with such a person

"Put away from yourselves the evil person"

Those who are outside

God
