Literary Considerations

*In the Greek, verses 2 through 10 of 1 Thessalonians are one sentence! This sentence is centered on the idea of thanks. It should remind us that thankfulness should be the major portion of our speech.

**Faith, love, and hope* (1 Thess. 1:3) are also mentioned by Paul in 1 Corinthians 13 but in a different order. According to Jon Paulien, whatever Paul wants to emphasize, he puts last in the list. In Corinthians he emphasizes love so he writes of "faith, hope, and love" while in 1 Thessalonians he emphasizes hope.
