Do You Know?

1 and 2 Thessalonians are likely the <u>oldest</u> books of the New Testament. They were written less than 20 years after Jesus' crucifixion. They are dated to A.D. 50 to 51.

What is in a Name?

The name Thessalonica means "victory over the tossing of the law." So when Paul writes to the church of the Thessalonians. it is to the church that is victor over the tossing of the law. What a great name! It is so appropriate that Paul writes to them about the "lawless one" (2 Thess. 2:8)! The ancient name of the city was Thermae which meant "hot springs." There were many hot springs found there. That's not a bad name either!
